VOSTOK SOS HAS IMPLEMENTED A ONE-YEAR HUMANITARIAN PROJECT WITH THE SUPPORT OF JAPANESE PARTNERS









The project "Evacuation of Vulnerable Civilians from the Areas Affected by the Humanitarian Crisis and Support for the Needs of IDPs", implemented in cooperation with the humanitarian organizations Peace Winds and Japan Platform, assisted 68 shelters in five regions of Ukraine.

To arrange the accommodation of IDPs we have procured:

- bedroom, bathroom, toilet, and laundry room equipment worth UAH 20,921,823;
- hot mobile meals for shelters in Dnipro worth UAH 22,337,270;
- hygiene kits and items for people with limited mobility worth UAH 2,077,390.

"We have directed aid to the regions with the highest number of IDPs from the occupied and de-occupied territories, namely the Kyiv, Cherkasy, Dnipro, Kirovohrad, and Poltava regions. Most of these people settle in shelters. To support the moral and physical well-being of IDPs, providing a comfortable and safe stay in such facilities is crucial", said Anastasiia Petriuk, the Foundation's project manager.






We have procured:

Items for bedroom, bathroom, toilet, and laundry room equipment:

- 74 boilers;
- 95 toilets;
- 58 shower cabins;
- 37 drying machines;
- 75 washing machines;
- 67 shower faucets; для душу;
- 43 washbasin faucets;
- 31 mirrors;
- 44 washbasins;
- 1346 single beds and mattresses;
- 106 functional beds with anti-decubitus mattresses;
- 120 bunk beds with mattresses;
- 3343 bath towels;
- 3423 sets of bed linen;
- 1519 pillows;
- 1599 blankets.









Hygiene kits and items for people with limited mobility:

- 750 standard hygiene kits;
- 376 men's hygiene kits;
- 647 women's hygiene kits;
- 61 hygiene kits for babies under 3 years old;
- 464 adult diapers and underpads;
- 4 wheeled sanitary chairs (for taking a shower);
- 50 mobile toilets.



Hot mobile meals for shelters in Dnipro:

• 239,906 portions.











The project supported the evacuation of people from the frontline areas. In total, 11,466 people were evacuated, including 2,642 people with limited mobility. Furthermore, 21 children were evacuated, the youngest being under the age of 1, and three older adults aged 100. Peace Winds Japan and Japan Platform supported the evacuation for 9 months and visited Ukraine with monitoring missions to monitor the evacuation process.

We appreciate our partners' consistent support. This is a crucial step towards further cooperation to achieve common humanitarian goals and help Ukrainians forced to flee their homes due to the war.
